Chairman of Vietnam Association of Invalids and Disabled Persons - Major General Le Ma Luong summarized the association's performance over the past 16 years

were signed. These products made by people with disabilities and war invalids were sent to friends all over the world. Therefore, the revenue of the member businesses increased significantly and the income of employees in the member businesses improved. Over 16 years of striving for growth, with nearly 1,000 member enterprises, organizing vocational training and creating jobs for nearly tens of thousands of laborers who are war invalids and people with disabilities nationwide, especially with our members, to be conferred the noble title of 'Labor Hero in the Renovation Period' by the Party and the State such as: 1/4 war invalids Tran Hong Quang - Director of Quang Minh Hai Phong War Invalids Collective Enterprise; War invalids 1/4 Le Hong Quang - Chairman of the 277 Joint Stock Company - Hanoi; Mr. Doan Xuan Tiep - Chairman of the Board of Directors of Chan Thien, my economic group. " - Major General Le Ma Luong said.

Attending the ceremony, Deputy Minister of Labor, Invalids and Social Affairs Le Tan Dung sent congratulations to the association and said: "Vietnam is a country that has experienced many wars to protect the country. Jidapha Nitiwirakun, a student at the Pattaya Redemptorist Technological College (PRTC) has won a gold medal at the Robot-Control Programming Competition. The team also won one silver medal at the Microsoft PowerPoint Program Competition and another silver medal at the Internet Search Competition., "2019 Global IT Challenge for Youth with Disabilities (GITC)" organized by the Rehabilitation International Korea (RI Korea).

This competition was held in Busan, South Korea. There were 20 participating countries including United Kingdom, South Korea, China, Thailand, Vietnam, India, Tibet, Kazakhstan, Sri Lanka, Laos, Myanmar, Ethiopia and many more.

Upon returning to Thailand she received congratulations from the Prime Minister, General Prayut Chan-o-cha and a plaque of honour from the Minister of Social Development and Human Security.

COVID-19: Who is protecting the people with disabilities?

GENEVA (17 March 2020) – Little has been done to provide people with disabilities with the guidance and support needed to protect them during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, even though many of them are part of the high-risk group, today warned the UN Special Rapporteur on the rights of persons with disabilities, Catalina Devandas. (UN rights expert)

"People with disabilities feel they have been left behind," the UN human rights expert said. "Containment measures, such as social distancing and self-isolation, may be impossible for those who rely on the support of others to eat, dress and bathe."

"This support is basic for their survival, and States must take additional social protection measures to guarantee the continuity of support in a safe manner throughout the crisis."

The UN expert stressed that reasonable accommodation measures are essential to enable people with disabilities to reduce contacts and the risk of contamination. They should be allowed to work from home or receive paid leave to guarantee their income security. Family members and caregivers may also require reasonable accommodation to provide support to people with disabilities during this period.

She stressed that people with disabilities deserve to be reassured that their survival is a priority and urged States to establish clear protocols for public health emergencies to ensure that, when medical resources are scarce, access to healthcare, including life-saving measures, does not discriminate against people with disabilities.
